Product also contains Streptavidin-HRP conjugate, which contains the same 3:1 mixture of 5-chloro-2-methyl-4-isothiazolin-3-one at low levels of ≤15 ppm.

Exposure/Engineering controls:	Selection and use of containment devices and personal protective equipment should be based on a risk assessment of exposure potential. Use local exhaust and/ or enclosure at aerosol/mist-generating points.
